Call for Papers

for Special Issue of Chinese Journal of Geophysicson EM Induction in the Earth

The Chinese Journal of Geophysics (SCI-E Journal) has agreed to host a special issue based on papers from our recent 19 EM induction Workshop in Beijing, China on October 23-29, 2008. Dr. Zhao Guoze and Dr. Nikolay Palshin will be the guest editors for these papers. Based on the response to the call we may be able to do a Special Issue containing 30-40 papers. We are looking for extended papers in the 20-30 double space page length (or equivalent in other formats). This will give you an opportunity to include more data, figures, and references as appropriate. Papers are due April 30th

In order to ensure timely publication of these papers we have set a short deadline of April 30. If this is not possible for you please contact the guest editors.

Submission Details

Manuscript submission: Manuscripts must be original high quality research papers, unpublished and not submitted for publication elsewhere. Overlap of contents between related papers should be minimum. An electronic version of original submission is advisable. Text files should be in Word or PDF format, figures and tables should be in press quality Portable Document Format, and submitted by e-mail: actageop@mail.igcas.ac.cn; husuf@mail.igcas.ac.cn.

Preparation of manuscripts: Manuscripts should be double-spaced. The paper should be arranged in the following order:

Title: brief, specific and informative.

Initials and surname(s) of the author(s): with superscript 1,2 referring to complete address, e-mail.

Abstract: up to 250 words.

Keywords: four or five keywords must be included.

Main text: may be divided into a maximum of three levels of headings; CAPITAL LETTERS for first order, bold lower case letters for second order, and bold italic lower case letter for third order heading.

Acknowledgements(if any).

References: double spaced and following the journal style(see below).

Appendices(if any).

Figure captions: figure captions must be provided separate from the figures of the manuscript. Make captures precise and explain all symbols and abbreviation used.

References: References in the text, figures, captions, and appendixes must be listed in the Reference section. Do not cite Congress Abstracts, papers that are in preparation, in review, or in revision. Reference number in the text should be square bracketed and put at the upper-right corner of the word at which it appears. References to the literature should be listed at the end of the manuscript, and numbered consecutively with square brackets enclosing the number in the sequence they appear in the text. Names of periodicals should be conventional abbreviations.

Units of measure: The International System of Units must be followed throughout.

Illustrations: The maximum size is that of one journal page (160x220mm) or of one column (75x220mm). A copy of each illustration should be sent reduced to the journal formats. Illustrations should be numbered consecutively as they are cited in the text. Regional maps should include National Grid or latitude/longitude coordinates. All illustration are called Fig., and should be referred to as Figure if at the start of a sentence, or as Fig. otherwise. Figure parts are referred to as (a), (b).

Tables: Table single or double column, numbered consecutively in the text at which it appears, and in the form Table 1. All tables should include a brief title, and columns should have an explanatory heading and, where appropriate, units of measurement. Footnotes to tables should be typed below the table, and should be referred to by superscript letters.

Appendices: Appendixes are optional. Title all appendixes (e.g., Appendix A. SAMPLE DESCRIPTIONS); number appendixes only if there are two or more. Tables and Figures in the Appendix should be numbered separately from the text (e.g., Fig. A1, Fig. A2, Table A1, etc.)

Publication fee: Author needs to be paid 250 RMB for a black and white page, and color reproduction will be accepted at the additional cost of 1200 RMB per page.

Prints: Twenty-eight reprints and one journal will be provided free of charge to the corresponding

author.
